There are to be no exceptions to this rule. If you need to complete new duties, you will be trained in the safe systems of work prior to completing it.</li> <li>Prescribed safe systems of work must be followed at all times. If you cannot do so, e.g. the required PPE is not available, you must not do the job. The safe system of work must be formally amended before adopting new work practices. Staff, contractors and others	Accident or injury caused by working in an unsafe manner	3	5	15	<ul> <li>There may be times due to staff absences when direct supervision levels may be lower than normal. During these times staff are expected to maintain normal working practices. Anyone failing to do so will be subject to the organisation's disciplinary procedures.</li> <li>If your pre-start check identifies any safety-critical faults, or a fault is identified during use, normal rules apply. The equipment must be taken out of use and corrective action taken. It must not be used if it is deemed to be unsafe.</li> <li>If training that has a fixed expiry date runs out, site management will speak to the training provider to seek guidance. In many instances, grace periods are being extended to reflect the lack of available courses.</li> </ul>	1	5	5

All staff to be sent a copy of this assessment and the Principal Contractor Coronavirus Action Plan by email. They are to read the documents and make themselves aware of the control measures/site rules before returning to work. They are to send an email to their manager to confirm they have completed this.</li> <li>On site, safe starts/TBT etc. are to be completed in small groups and whilst maintaining 2m social distancing rule.</li> <li>During the safe start, both the staff and site manager to confirm that any tasks to be completed during the shift, can be completed in compliance with the 2m social distancing rule.</li> <li>Before work recommences, site manager to re-brief staff on new site rules, i.e. new routes, welfare facility rules etc.</li> </ul>	1	5	5
